

Develop Student Workforce Skills

Apply by November 25th for the Spring 2023 Cohort to lead a team at your academic institution

The Global Solutions Sustainability Challenge (GSSC), is a virtual business competition that connects students in the United States, Jordan, and Iraq on binational teams to virtually collaborate through the design thinking process during eight weeks to create a sustainable business concept to a real need in their community related to the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Binational teams engage via Zoom and Slack, developing problem solving skills and global competencies. Binational teams submit a business concept and video pitch. At the culminating event, the Virtual Global Business Expo, the top five teams present their pitch live to a panel of judges comprised of professionals in entrepreneurship where the three finalists' teams are provided a small grant to further develop their prototype.

Program Timeline

To participate in the program, facilitators must apply on behalf of their students and institutions.

Selected facilitators will:

- Form and lead a team from their institution;
- Participate in professional development training;
- Partner effectively with their co-facilitator in the US, Jordan or Iraq;
- Lead the team's virtual and in person collaboration through the provided curriculum.

Facilitators are provided:

- Certificate of participation;
- CEU for facilitator training;
- Honorarium of 350 USD:
- Challenge Stipend to use for technology and supplies.

After completing the Challenge, students will:

- Receive a certificate of participation
- Become alumni of the US Department of State (afforded unique opportunities to apply for professional development and grants)
- Receive electronic YES Badges to add directly to LinkedIn / CV for: Critical thinking and creative problem solving, cross cultural communication, virtual collaboration, empathy, adaptability, entrepreneurship
- Finalist team members will receive opportunity to participate in an optional virtual professional development course from a university in the United States
