Apply by November 25th for the Spring 2023 Cohort to lead a team at your academic institution.

Join the Global Solutions Conversations virtual exchange with students to engage in cross cultural communication and share ideas on improving sustainability in a global community.

What is it? A virtual exchange that connects students in the United States, Jordan, and Iraq on binational teams through a series of six weekly dialogues on culture, design thinking, and the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Who is this program for? College students in the US, Jordan and Iraq.

What is required? Attend six Zoom sessions with your binational group. Little work outside the calls is required for students. Facilitators lead their binational group of students through the provided curriculum where students develop empathy and global citizenship.

What will occur during the calls? Engage in a conversation with a group of students from another country and learn about culture, discuss sustainability in your community, and practice the human centered design process.

When will this occur? The binational calls will occur weekly from October through early November.

Program Timeline

November 25, 2022: Application Deadline

January 2023: Facilitator Training

February - April 2023: Six Week Dialogue

To participate in the program, facilitators must apply on behalf of their students and institutions.

Selected facilitators will:

- Form and lead a team from their institution
- Participate in professional development training
- Co-facilitate virtual conversations with their binational team

Facilitators are provided:

- Certificate of participation
- Honorarium of 200 USD
