

### The Multi-Union Model at BAU Empowering Students' Leadership Skills

Al-Balqa Applied University (BAU) shows an intense dedication to learning representation by implementing a detailed decentralized structure for student participation. Student representation at BAU functions through the supervision of the **Deanship of Student Affairs** over multiple student bodies and associations that exist independently, "student unions", as the Deanship of Student Affairs at BAU operates a diverse student union structure with clubs and activities which create platforms to both train student leadership and facilitate disciplinary blending along with encompassing all student demographics in all university locations. The decentralized model represents diverse student groups, including undergraduate and postgraduate students, international students, and students with disabilities, to advance their personal growth while improving academic and professional preparation. The student engagement activities at Al-Balqa Applied University (BAU) are an essential organizational foundation to achieve university goals regarding inclusive education and civic empowerment with sustainable development.

Through its coordination framework, the Deanship of Student Affairs delivers various programs and services that address comprehensive student needs. Student learning extends beyond traditional classroom experiences, as BAU promotes leadership development through cultural activities alongside service-based educational engagements, as described in SDG 4 (Quality Education). SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities) receives support through specific services for students with disabilities and international students. SDG 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions) develops open systems and established frameworks for civic value education, which builds institutional partnerships within the university educational environment. SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) emphasizes the utility of local community partnerships, national



organizations, and civil society entities to promote student development and societal impact for their students.

The student engagement structure at BAU demonstrates full support for SDG 5 (Gender Equality). BAU maintains full gender inclusion by enabling female students to fill leadership positions through student union programming, club activities, and campus initiatives. The Deanship of Student Affairs regularly conducts programs and workshops that emphasize women's rights, health awareness, empowerment, and gender-based inclusion to advance gender equality directly. The university advances environmental stewardship while developing climate-conscious actions in its student body, supporting SDG 13 (Climate Action).

It reaches sustainability goals by conducting environmental clubs, awareness campaigns, cleanup drives, tree-planting events, and sustainability and climate change seminars. Through its initiatives, BAU enables students to develop into change-making environmental agents who actively fight climate change.

The **multi-union and club model at BAU** presents a sustainable method of student governance that supports student development while bolstering the university's goal of empowering its student population to achieve a sustainable atmosphere that follows the SDGs.



### **Deanship of Student Affairs Departments**

### The Department of Student Organizations and Activities

This department supports cultural, artistic, social, and volunteer activities while developing public service opportunities with civil society organizations. Through this framework, the institution supervises active student clubs such as the Community Peace Club, Public Service Club, Clubs for Students with Disabilities, and International Students.

### The Department of Sports Activities

Directs its efforts to organize athletic events, sports training, and local and international university team competitions while building connections with the neighboring community through inclusive recreational activities.

### The Department of International Student Affairs

Dedicates itself to providing optimal care for non-Jordanian students while supporting their academic success at BAU.



### **Democratic Student Representation at BAU**

Student scientific associations exist at faculties of Al-Balqa Applied University (BAU) to serve as academic extracurricular support agencies for their student population. The university officially provides "Instructions for Student Scientific Associations at Al-Balqa Applied University" with specific rules governing these associations.

### **Democratic Student Representation at BAU: Annual Election Process**

The Student Scientific Associations in BAU colleges successfully carry out democratic student representation through their yearly voting processes. The elections function under leadership from the Dean of Student Affairs and the Higher Elections Committee to provide students with governance participation. Student representatives embrace three duties following their election: addressing academic and scientific matters, improving cultural and social activities, and enhancing student-administrator and student-faculty relationships. The method promotes democratic principles while fostering student involvement across the university space according to BAU's commitment to these values.

Al-Balqa Applied University (BAU) has established comprehensive regulations governing student scientific associations, as outlined in the official document titled "Instructions for Student Scientific Associations at Al-Balqa Applied University." These regulations were enacted based on the decision of the University's Council of Deans No. 2018/2017/510, dated February 5, 2018.



### Key Provisions of the Regulations:

### 1- Establishment and Objectives:

Each college within BAU forms a "Student Scientific Association" to represent its students, with its headquarters located on the college campus.

### 2- The objectives of these associations include:

- Representing students and addressing their academic concerns with the college administration.
- Participating in supporting the academic, cultural, and social journey of university students.
- Providing opportunities for positive academic interaction between students, faculty, staff,
  and the college administration.
- Fostering a spirit of dialogue, respect for diverse opinions, and enhancing cooperation.
- Encouraging participation in various purposeful student activities that contribute to the advancement of the educational process.
- Promoting a sense of belonging to the nation and its leadership.
- Facilitating constructive engagement with local communities and their institutions, in coordination with the college administration, to achieve the university's goals.
- Collaborating with the college administration to provide assistance to needy students, with prior approval.
- Maintaining the university's reputation and property.



### 3. Membership and Elections:

- The General Assembly comprises students enrolled in the college seeking a degree (Bachelor's or Diploma) and attending classes.
- The Administrative Body of the association consists of elected members from the General Assembly, with a minimum of five members and not exceeding the number of academic departments in the college.

### 4. Eligibility criteria for candidacy include:

- A cumulative GPA of at least "Good."
- Enrollment in at least 12 credit hours during the election semester.
- Completion of at least one semester at the college.
- At least two semesters remaining before graduation, excluding the election semester.
- No prior disciplinary actions.

#### 5. Operational Guidelines:

- Associations must operate within the university's regulations and are prohibited from engaging in activities beyond their specified objectives.
- Meetings and activities should be conducted on campus in designated areas approved by the college administration.
- Members are expected to adhere to university regulations, association bylaws, and work towards achieving the association's goals.

### Global and National Integration of Student Associations at Al-Balqa Applied University

Al-Balqa Applied University (BAU) is strongly committed to fostering student leadership, encouraging community engagement, and promoting international collaboration. The University actively supports the integration of student associations within its colleges into broader national and international networks. A prime example of this initiative is the Medical College Students Association, which is affiliated with the International Federation of Medical Students' Associations – Jordan (IFMSA-Jo).

Through this strategic partnership, medical students at BAU not only maintain a vibrant and active union presence on campus but also participate in impactful national and international programs focused on health, human rights, and sustainability. This affiliation empowers students to take part in initiatives that contribute to the development of their leadership capacities and global citizenship.

The **BAU Local Committee** (**BAU-LC**) of **IFMSA-Jo** was established in 2020 by a group of visionary medical students. In 2022, it achieved full membership status during the 20th National General Assembly held at Jordan University of Science and Technology. This milestone marked BAU's official integration into a nationally recognized and internationally active network of future medical professionals, united by a shared commitment to healthcare advocacy, education, and community service.

Founded in 1997 and nestled in the highlands of Al-Salt, BAU witnessed the rapid evolution of its local IFMSA-Jo committee from a modest student initiative into a well-organized and dynamic community. The BAU-LC has made substantial contributions at both national and international



levels, spearheading a diverse range of projects that span scientific advancement and public service. Its passionate and creative members continue to implement innovative ideas that enhance medical education and deliver meaningful benefits to society.

#### **Affiliation with the National Student Union Framework**

In addition to its global outreach, Al-Balqa Applied University ensures that its student union is fully integrated into the broader **National Student Union framework** in Jordan. This affiliation strengthens the representation of BAU students at the national level, enabling them to actively participate in shaping student policy, sharing experiences with peers across other universities, and contributing to collective student development initiatives. Through this national affiliation, BAU students gain access to cross-institutional dialogue, national forums, and leadership training programs, reinforcing their role as influential agents of positive change within both academic and societal spheres.





#### **Structure and Activities**

BAU-LC operates under IFMSA-Jo as six separate Standing Committees whose mission is to tackle fundamental public health and sustainable development aspects. Through its activities, SCOPH (Public Health) conducts health education programs that include World Health Day observance and anti-smoking initiatives targeting preventive medical services and health enhancement. Through the BAU-LC integration into IFMSA-Jo, the organization has taken an important step that ensures sustainability, combined with equity and innovation, penetrates all aspects of student life. BAU strengthens its position as Jordan's transformative higher education institution by developing medical leaders with academic excellence, social consciousness, and a global worldview. The union stands as an example that shows students can lead meaningful change that becomes vital to national development and global well-being.

- SCORA implements health education programs about AIDS prevention and reproductive health rights while delivering educational content on sensitive subjects.
- The SCORP organization defends human rights and promotes peace by delivering workshops and organizing campaigns. It also engages in volunteering activities focused on helping refugees and marginalized population groups.
- SCOME's medical education division functions to improve teaching excellence by organizing peer-to-peer educational programs, conducting curriculum assessments, and pursuing educational programs that focus on student-centered learning.
- COPE & SCORE (Professional and Research Exchange) creates transformative overseas exchange programs that enhance academic and cultural development for BAU students while enabling them to conduct clinical and research activities abroad.



These student union committees develop leadership abilities, research skills, and volunteer opportunities for BAU-involved students, building their capabilities to support local communities and global society.
