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Youth English Language Training Program Launched

In partnership with the Ministry of Youth, the University will implement a training program to develop English communication skills for youth aged 12-17. The program will serve 520 participants across 26 youth centers throughout the Kingdom.

Minister of Culture Emphasizes Universities' Cultural Role

Minister of Culture Mustafa Al-Rawashdeh visited campus to discuss expanding cooperation in implementing cultural programs for students and the local community. President Dr. Ahmad Fakhri Al-Ajlouni affirmed the University's commitment to integrating culture into the educational process.



Parliamentary Education Committee Visits Campus



The Parliamentary Education Committee visited campus to assess developments in higher and technical education. President Dr. Ahmad Fakhri Al-Ajlouni emphasized the University's role as Jordan's national pillar for technical education, highlighting specialized programs in artificial intelligence, data science, and cybersecurity aligned with Fourth Industrial Revolution demands. Committee members commended the institution's academic programs and infrastructure.



Fulbright Program Delegation Welcomed

President Dr. Ahmad Fakhri Al-Ajlouni received Fulbright fellows participating in academic programs at Princess Alia University College. The meeting addressed their academic experience and contributions to educational enrichment and cultural exchange. The University continues to prioritize international exchange programs to foster knowledge sharing and cross-cultural engagement.



EU Research Grant Secured for Climate Research

The University has been awarded a €2.7 million research project funded by the European Union under the PRIMA program. The initiative will establish a platform for measuring carbon sequestration in Mediterranean Basin wetlands through collaborative partnerships with research universities in Italy, Greece, Turkey, Egypt, and Tunisia. This award demonstrates the University's competitiveness within selective European funding programs.

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\$10 Million KOICA Joint Project Concludes

The University has concluded its joint project with the Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA) to advance technical education at Irbid and Karak University Colleges. The initiative focused on curriculum modernization, capacity building, and infrastructure development. University President Dr. Ahmad Fakhri Al-Ajlouni described the project as a successful model of international partnership that strengthens technical education and labor market alignment.

President Meets Staff at Karak University College



President Dr. Ahmad Fakhri Al-Ajlouni met with administrative and academic staff at Karak University College to review operations and address employee needs. Al-Ajlouni emphasized the vital role of both teams in supporting the educational process, noting that institutional development begins with investing in human resources and fostering a work environment based on fairness, transparency, and equal opportunity.



Medical Education Partnership Established

The University signed a memorandum of understanding with the Jordanian American Physicians Association to enhance cooperation in medical education, research, and training. The agreement facilitates joint research, seminars, educational material development, and clinical training opportunities for students in the United States.



President Chairs Private University Colleges Council Meeting

President Dr. Ahmad fakhri Al-Ajlouni chaired the Council of Deans of Private University Colleges to discuss curriculum development and technical education modernization. The meeting addressed faculty promotion procedures, comprehensive exam development, and instructor capacity building.



ASEZA Partnership Discussions Advance

University leadership met with the Aqaba Special Economic Zone Authority to explore academic and training cooperation. Discussions addressed student housing at Aqaba University College, local development support, educational outcomes aligned with labor market needs, and student training opportunities within Aqaba's institutions.

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TechForward Initiative Launched with intaj Partnership

The University signed a memorandum of understanding with the Information and Communications Technology Association (intaj) to implement the TechForward initiative. The program enables students to complete applied capstone projects in partnership with technology companies, enhancing professional readiness and labor market competitiveness.

President Visits Ma'an University College



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Arbor Day Celebrated with Tree-Planting Initiative

Virtual Exchange Program with Miami Dade College


M&E Expert Sought for EU-Funded Project




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
